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

The pretest result showed that, among 243 participants, 3(1%) had A+ Grade, 21(9%) had A Grade, 35(14%) obtained B+ Grade,58(24%) had B Grade,23(10%) had C Grade, and 103(42%) had D Grade knowledge, whereas in post-test 82(34%) had A+ Grade, 73(30%) had A Grade,67(27%) had B+ Grade,21(9%) had B grade and 0(0%)had C,D grade consecutively.

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Hence, it was concluded that, workshop on "pap smear" was effective in improving



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
